Who We Are

The Claude W. and Dolly Ahrens Foundation (CDAF) is a unique family foundation striving to help meet the needs of Grinnell and its neighboring communities through ongoing support and resources by maintaining and perpetuating an endowment. Our purpose is to provide improved and enhanced quality of life for present and future generations with interest in the areas of parks and recreation, education, and health with our collaborative partners.







What We Do

Giving back is central to all activities and funded projects of the Claude W. and Dolly Ahrens Foundation. Below are brief examples of ongoing programs and services funded by the Foundation. Full descriptions can be found on the website at www.ahrensfamilyfoundation.org.

The Ahrens Park Foundation, a

private operating foundation, owns and operates the Ahrens/Paschall Memorial Park, a sports complex that includes eight youth softball and baseball fields, two outdoor basketball courts, two tennis courts, a sand volleyball court, several playground areas and shelters, three soccer fields, a golf driving range, a sledding hill, an outdoor walking path, and indoor facilities in the Grinnell Athletic and Recreation Center.

The Ahrens Family Center

houses the Grinnell Community
Day Care and Preschool and Midlowa Community Action's Head
Start program. The center features
an indoor youth gymnasium and
swimming pool, where young
children are taught to swim and
enjoy leisure activities.

Community Support Services

Program helps to build capacity and create efficiencies for 25 area non-profit partner organizations and community campaigns. Examples of support services provided to partner organizations by CDAF include general accounting and financial services; donor management services; marketing and website assistance; mailing and fundraising event management services; human resource practices and administrative support; and meeting space.


The Dolly Ahrens Scholarship
Program rewards Grinnell
High School graduating seniors
of character with one-time
scholarships to colleges or
universities of their choice. The
program seeks nominees who
are self-directed, responsible

contributors to the community.

Over \$500,000 in scholarships has been awarded to date.

The "Leave It Better Than You Found It" Award recognizes local non-profit organizations that have left a mark on the Grinnell community. To date, the annual program has honored more than 300 area individuals, groups and organizations. The award was initiated in 1994 at the dedication of the Ahrens/Paschall Memorial Park and commemorates the birthday of the late Claude Ahrens.

The Lend a Hand Program was created in 2010 as an opportunity for the boards, staffs and family members of the Foundations and their partner organizations to participate in community service activities on a monthly basis.



Why We Do It

- Leaving it better is the legacy that guides us and the mission that motivates us.
- Our vision is to enhance the quality of life for future generations in the Grinnell community and its neighboring communities.
- Claude Ahrens' entrepreneurial spirit drove his highly successful business ventures in hybrid seed corn,
 playground and recreation equipment and livestock watering systems. This spirit also carried his vision
 to "leave it better than you found it" as he began to give back to his home community through the Ahrens/
 Paschall Memorial Park, the Claude W. Ahrens Charitable Trust and his foundations. The third generation
 of Ahrens family members champions his legacy through numerous community programs and services
 described in this brochure and on the website.

How We Do It

CDAF actively seeks projects and organizations in the fields of parks and recreation, education and health that it chooses to fund and does not accept solicitations or direct requests.

Since Claude Ahrens established the initial trust, more than \$20 million has been granted to worthwhile organizations and projects throughout Iowa, with emphasis on impact in Claude's home community of Grinnell. Roughly \$12 million in grants has been awarded by the CDAF.

- \$125,000 to Communities for Literate Iowa Kids (CLIK), Grinnell program
- \$505,000 to Drake Community Library capital campaign
- \$30,000 to Grinnell Community Daycare and Preschool campaign, matching grant
- \$1 million to Grinnell High School expansion campaign
- \$100,000 to Grinnell-Newburg Educational Excellence's (GNEE) mini-grant program

- \$800,000 to Grinnell Regional Medical Center Blueprint for Health capital campaign
- \$20,000 to Heart of Iowa Big Brothers Big Sisters, Grinnell mentoring program
- \$100,000 to Iowa Valley Community College, Grinnell capital campaign
- \$10,000 to Poweshiek Animal League Shelters (PALS), matching grant
- \$250,000 to University of Northern Iowa, Ahrens Playground Safety Suite
- \$100,000 to Strand Theater, LLC, Community Investment






