FOOD RESOURCES

- Drake Community Library Food Cupboard: 930 Park St. at the west entrance; Open during library hours Mon -Thurs 10:00am-8:00pm, Fri 10:00am-6:00pm, Sat 10:00am-5:00pm. Limited pantry options.
- Fareway: Double Up Food Bucks program from SNAP to be used on the purchase of fresh produce. Buy \$1 worth of SNAP eligible product and receive \$1 to be used on fresh produce.
- Farmer's Market: Beginning in June, located at Central Park. Thursday's 3:00-6:00pm, Saturday's 10:00am-Noon. Debit, credit, SNAP cards accepted, and Double Up Food Bucks program available. WIC and Senior Checks accepted. Call 641-236-6555 or go to www.grinnellfarmersmarket.com to learn more.
- Food Recovery Network: Distribution of previously prepared food. Drive by and pick up noon at 1st Presbyterian Church, 1025 5th Ave. Tues, Thurs, and Sat. Call 641-990-1610 for delivery needs.
- Giving Gardens: During the spring-summer growing season. Visit www.ahrensfamilyfoundation.org/giving-gardens for a map of garden locations.
- Grinnell Community Meal: (formerly the Blessed Community meal, now combined with Davis Community Meal) served at the Grinnell United Methodist Church, corner of 5th and Park St. Enter the Park St. door. Meal served on Thursdays at 5:30pm. Meal available to anyone in the community. Please sign up by Wednesday at Noon by calling the office at 641-236-3757.
- Grinnell School District: Food Pantries for students at the Middle School and High School.
- Iowa Café: Individuals 60 years and older and live in Grinnell may be eligible to participate in the meal at WestSide Diner. Please call 800-779-8707 to enroll. All meals are available on a contribution basis.
- The Iowa Kitchen: The Iowa Kitchen serves a need-blind community meal out of the logo-painted kitchen door on the north side of 834 Park Street every Saturday between 12:00-12:30pm. Call 641-236-3657 before Saturday each week to reserve your free prepared meal. Leave a name and time (between noon & 1:00pm) when food will be picked up.
- Local Foods Connection: Weekly box of seasonal food, May-October, free to LFC clients. Referrals from MICA, your local physician, Station Clubhouse, or your faith leader. Learn more at www.localfoodsconnection.com.
- Meals-On-Wheels: Individuals 60 years and older may be eligible and must complete an application to participate. Please call 800-779-8707. Meals are available on a contribution basis.
- MICA: 609 4th Avenue, 641-236-3923. First time visitors will fill out basic paperwork; do not need to bring anything with you. Food from the pantry is available twice a month and is a choice pantry. Fresh produce and bread are available anytime. Hours: Mon, Tues, Thur, Fri 9:00am-4:00pm. Also available, infant items like diapers, formula, wipes, soap and lotion. Hygiene and household cleaning products are also available.
- Prairie Produce: Fresh produce during the summer months, hours 11am-6pm, daily. Other items available in the winter and by appointment only, please call 641-990-9796. Debit, credit, SNAP cards accepted, and Double Up Food Bucks program, WIC checks accepted.
- SNAP- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program: Find out eligibility and an application through DHS hhs.iowa.gov/how-to-apply.
- Tiger Packs: Students preK-8th grade, a bag of nutritious, kid-friendly food for the weekend. Talk with your student's teacher or school to sign up.
